Kansas City, MO.—The Disabled American Veterans (DAV) organization is pleased to announce the opening of its New Chapter Hall on Saturday, May 13th at 14605 E US 40 Highway, Kansas City, MO. The Hall is located a block East of Old Time Pottery at 40 and Noland Rd.

“Our hope is that our Hall will give back to the community as an event and meeting space. We are also excited to have a new place for veterans to meet and find out about how the DAV may be able to help them,” said Adjutant Dave Gerke. “We want this Hall to become a destination spot for the community not only for their events and meetings, but as a place where they can enjoy public events as well.”

The Disabled American Veterans is a nonprofit charity that provides a lifetime of support for veterans of all generations and their families, helping more than 1 million veterans in positive, life-changing ways each year. The organization provides more than 670,000 rides for veterans attending medical appointments and assists veterans with more than 292,000 benefit claims annually. In 2016, DAV helped attain more than \$4 billion in new and retroactive benefits to care for veterans, their families and survivors.

The Grand Opening Celebration is planned for Saturday, May 13th from 10am to Noon. The public is invited to participate in the ceremonies, tour the facility and learn about the DAV.
